Acquainting ourselves thoroughly with the present scenario, it is indeed inevitable for us to understand the need of the hour, that is, learning to believe in oneself. The students are taught to become self-reliant, self-contained and self-dependent in the current times. Acknowledging the present situation, the subject experts are well familiar with the fact that virtual education can never replace the physical schooling. The educators are well aware with the complications and barriers in the process of imparting education; therefore, a new and improved education policy is introduced for the betterment of the students nationwide. Recently, the union cabinet has approved the New Education Policy with an aim to introduce several changes in the education system- from the school to the college level.

The NEP 2020 aims at making "India a global knowledge superpower". Following are some of the key points under the policy:

- ⇒ Universalization of education from pre school to secondary level with 100 percent Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) in school education by 2030.
- ⇒ The current 10+2 system to be replaced by a new 5+3+3+4 curricular structure corresponding to ages 3-8, 8-11, 11-14 and 14-18 years of age respectively.
- ⇒ Class 10 and 12 board examinations to be made easier, to test core competencies rather than memorized facts, with all students allowed to take the exam twice.
- ⇒ Emphasis on Foundational Literacy and Numeracy, no rigid separation between academic streams, extracurricular, vocational streams in schools.

Thus, these are the few points to be noted under reformed policy for education where the amendments are done keeping in mind, a better and suitable accepted education system worldwide. This includes working with the earlier implemented Art Integrated Learning, Project Based Learning and Experiential Learning approaches. It is, therefore, important for us to understand that the only thing constant in the world is 'change' and how quickly and comfortably we accept it, is totally in our hands.



Moving forth, the parents were notified about the successful CBSE board results where the school topper was felicitated by DCP, Dwarka. Apart from all the achievements, the parents were educated about the reversal in their roles from just being spectators, they were told to be facilitators in the ongoing process. The digital well being was also talked about in detail.

The vice principal briefed the parents about the multimodal approach of learning. They were informed about the visual, aural and kinesthetic which were to be used in an appropriate amount equally in the learning process. The ways to achieve the multimodal learning was also told by her. The in-charge explained the outcomes that are achieved by following the multimodal learning. The learning outcomes derived by the application of the new approach were also mentioned in the slides. The introduction of Art Integrated Learning, Experiential Learning and Project Based Learning was also given.

All three forms were described in detail and its application under each subject was informed to all the parents by the subject experts. They educated the parents about various activities that can be undertaken under each approach. They also talked about the utilization and the need to bring this into the curriculum teaching. Another aspect that was introduced to the parents was ‘Inter-Disciplinary Approach’ where all the subjects are taught together. An example to explain the concept was also provided to clarify the topic even more. The changed criteria of assessment were informed to the parents where the changes and alterations were told and the reductions in the syllabus as per the CBSE norms were also talked. The teachers told the parents about the new forms of assessments such as Multiple-Choice Questions, Activity Based, Personal Interview and Quizzes. They were briefed about the process and requirement of the same.

Lastly, the queries of the parents were also catered by the principal. The queries were cleared in a very apt manner where the parents were comforted with the answers. The forum was kept open for all the parents. The principal thanked all the parents for their precious time and all the teachers for their hard work in order to put up such an informative session. The orientation was thus, an acknowledgement of the changes. It was a well-organized and planned session.

Bonding Bonds Digitally



MULTI MODAL TEACHING LEARNING BY PRIMARY WING






Thanking thy Nurturers




World Hepatitis Day (WHD)






'Twinkle Toes and Bouncing Boots'
