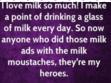




















## **GLOBAL DAY OF PARENTS**

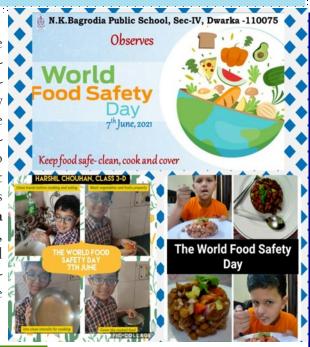

# **World Blood Donation Day**



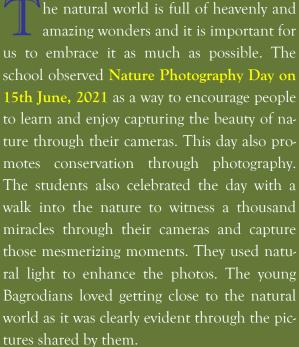

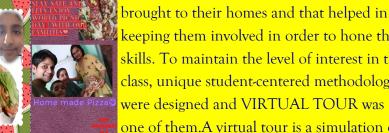

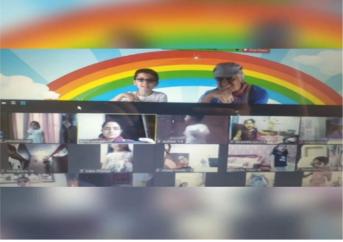

Students were also engaged in the online reading session on the day. Active participation by the students was witnessed and they also showcased creativity at its best. Following activities were conducted for classes:

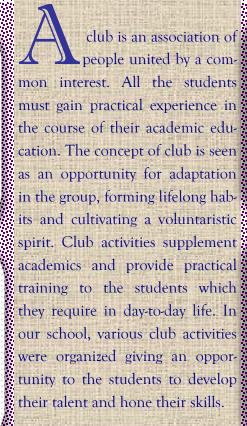
Class VI-Make a ppt or design a poster with a slogan highlighting the importance of reading on 'National Reading Day'.

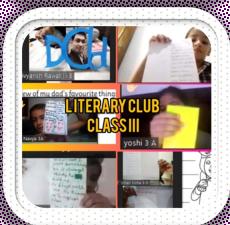

## **WORLD REFUGEE DAY**

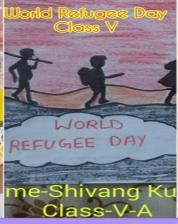
"A refugee is someone who survived and who can create the future."

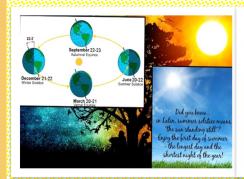


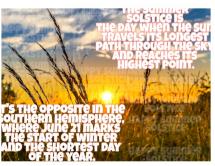

# Summer Solstice Day

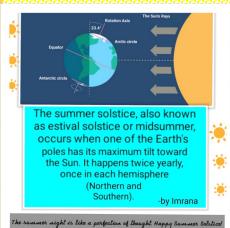

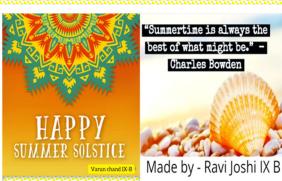














# <u>World Drug Day</u>

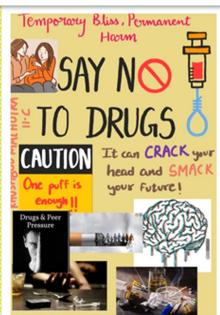

#### Following is a brief report of all the events held as a part of the Summit:

#### 1. Quester

#### 2. Jashn-E-Aaina

The live event 'Jashn-E-Aaina' (class IX & X) for the igniting and budding RJs (Radio Jockeys) to showcase their talents. . This time approximate 28 schools came forth to participate.

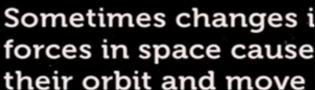
# World Asteroid Day"

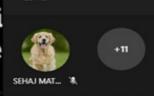

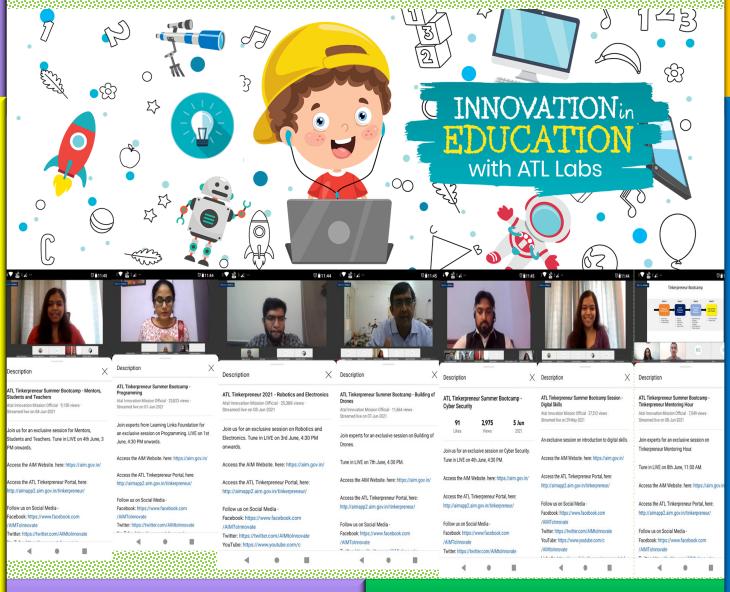






# ATAL Tinkerpreneurship 2021

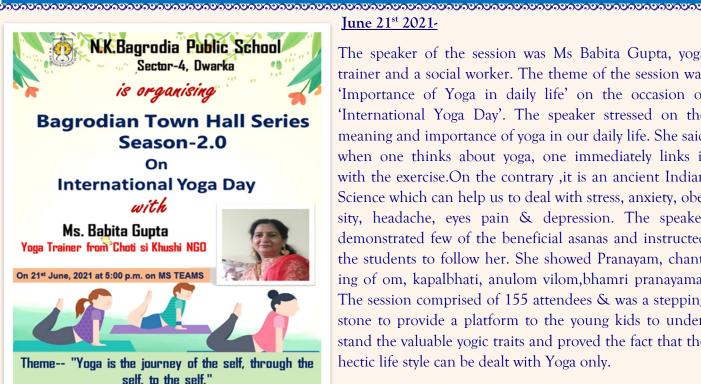

Project Based Learning/Inquiry Based Learning: The speakers of the session were Ms. Manjula Goel and Ms. Anjana Nagrath. The session was conducted on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2021 at 11:00 am. The webinar commenced with an aim to enhance knowledge about project-based learning or inquiry-based learning. It started with the description of various scientists and their contribution in the field of science. The key concepts that make up the competency-based education include demonstrated mastery of a competency, meaningful types of assessment, individualized support for students, and the creation and application of knowledge. Students are more engaged in the material because they have ownership over their learning. They are empowered because they have control over when, where and how they learn. This kind of approach helps students to use and improve many of their emerging skills like high order thinking skills, independent learning, excitement and motivation, critical thinking, creative thinking, communication skills, social skills etc. This webinar highlighted the ways the teachers can implement CBE in their classrooms to help the students to develop competencies and gain mastery over their learning.
