








## **INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY- SEPTEMBER 8**


## **WORLD TOURISM DAY-SEPTEMBER 27**




## **WORLD HEART DAY-SEPTEMBER 29**










## **BAGRODIAN TOWNHALL SEASON 2.0**

## SUBJECT ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

#### Science

Learning by doing is more fun and long lasting. Keeping in line with it, the students of class VII performed experiments with materials available at home to study about layers of soil, rock particles of different sizes, humus and importance of each component of soil.

#### Social Studies

Various activities such as role play for revision of the chapter was done in the class. Students performed such activities wearing the beautiful garbs for it. A highlight of the activity is presented in the list below:

- Students were tested onto the fact whether they have learnt the concept or not by checking the validity of the facts by this game.

Students' interests are always maintained if they are nurtured by learning in a playful method. So, the students were taught certain aspects of the social studies topics by using certain applications in which they enjoyed answering using Pictionary and other forms.







#### Maths

Various cutting and pasting activities were conducted in classes so that students can grasp the concept by the method of experiential learning. The students presented their ideas about various topics using the presentations for the deeper knowledge of the concept. An activity named 'Fun With Mathematics' was conducted to stimulate students' interest in maths and help them with the application skills in maths as many mental maths related activities were conducted.

## **ASTRONOMY ACTIVITIES**

#### 1) Webinar on- 'Fantastic Bursts and How to Find Them'

Date & Time- September 6, 2021

Organised by Nehru Planetarium

Resource Person- Dr <u>Devansh Agarwal</u>, currently working as a Data Scientist at Bristol Myers Squibb, the USA, Ms. Prerna Chandra.

An online learning opportunity for astronomy enthusiasts was organised by Nehru Planetarium for the topic 'Fantastic Bursts and How to Find Them'. The resource person Dr. Devansh Agarwal explained about Fast Radio Bursts (FRBs) which are quick and unpredictable flashes in the sky, coming from incredibly far away, outside our galaxy objects. It was also told that to detect FRBs, astronomers survey broad swaths of sky and have to manually search for a few real signals among thousands of false signals detected every day. Artificial Intelligence is being used to automatically detect the FRBs among this hay-stack of false signals. The session discussed all the latest ingestions in the field of artificial intelligence peeping into the cosmos.

Radio skies at night look different. GBT (green bank telescope) is used for 6500 hrs on a yearly on 1 GHz to 100GHz. Lighting can be seen from other side of earth as magnetic field lines carry electrons. And it also causes dispersion as higher frequency waves travel faster. FRB (fast radio bursts) are received by telescopes and the FRB occurs outside the milky way and the path between the host and the earth is also ionised. Using the number of electrons between the host and the earth, we can estimate the distance between the earth and the host. FRB is also known as Lorimer Burst. This is what the signal looks like after the dispersion.

Theories suggest that they might come from black holes.


Flow chart for search for FRBs:


There are either non-repeater and repeater FRBs, and some repeater FRBs occur in set periods of time.

NN (neural networks) are algorithms used for detecting FRBs, reducing human effort. NNs are inspired by human nervous cells. Filters are used on convoked images in order to extract information. This is what a convolution neural network looks like:Trained CNNs are called FETCH. FETCH has a 99.5% accuracy rate and can classify 50000 FRBs per hour.

Learning Outcome: This session was an interesting and captivating which left students with a lot of information, knowledge about FRBs

The sunspot AR2770 was detected earlier and is expected to grow in size in the upcoming days. It also discussed the details on this solar activity of Coronal Mass ejection and the progress cycle of the Sun.

It was very informative for all the children as they got to know about many informative things. Mr. Siddhart Madan told about a lot of things like what are sunspots and how these spots have much higher magnefic fields within them as compared to the outside and allow us to calculate the rotational gradient of the sun










## **COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM**


