(1st JULY, 2022 – 7th JULY, 2022)

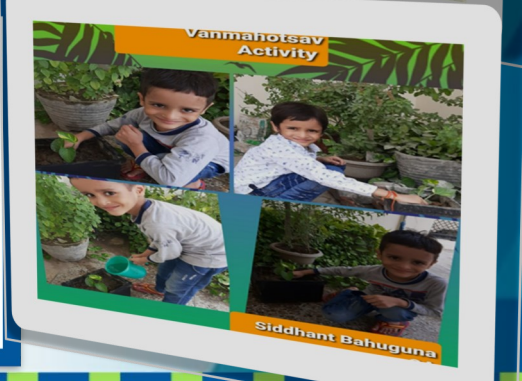
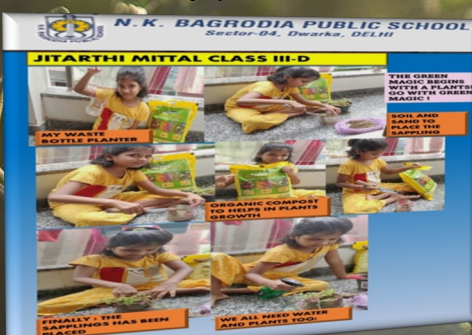

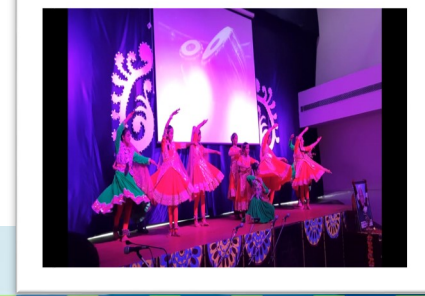
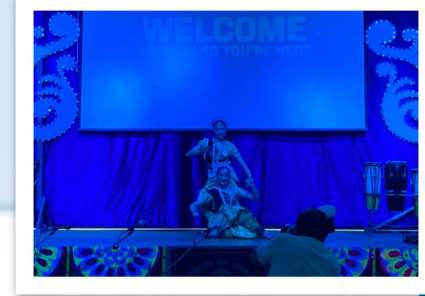
The students enthusiastically participated in the event and showed great interest.

*Ad lib*, an extempore in the English language turned out to be a great learning experience for the Participants. Almost 22 students of classes IX & X from various schools participated in this event. An On-the-spot speech was to be prepared based on proverbs. Everyone was given a proverb through draw lots. Each one of them was given 5 minutes of preparation time and then 2 mins Presentation time. The students showcased their mesmerising oratory skills. The observer Ms. Shashwati Bagchi directed the students to adhere to the set guidelines of the event and express their opinions with conviction. She enthralingly perceived the views of every child and appreciated their endeavour to face the audience confidently. The judgement was done on the scale of four criteria: Diction, Articulation, Relevance and Delivery. The most deserving participant Aanvi from BGS School, Dwarka was declared the Best Performer of this event.

TRISHNA unfurled the combination of dance and music (*Nrityavani*) with patriotic feelings in one and all. The observer of the event Ms Vandana Gupta, a renowned Dancer and Choreographer, graced the occasion. The observer for the event was Ms. Shalu Jain, PGT & HOD Mathematics, Vishal Bharati Public School. There were two rounds in the event - The preliminary round and the final fun game round. For the Preliminary round, 30 Multiple choice questions were given to the students. They were allotted 15 minutes to solve those questions. The preliminary round tested the mathematical aptitude of the students. From this round, the best 4 teams were chosen to proceed to the final fun game round.

The '*Geometry Dash Rattle*' competition was organized for classes I and II under a thought-provoking theme "*Invertising Razzmatazz*". 18 Schools from Dwarka participated in the Competition. Mind-blowing ideas were demonstrated by students. They prepared very creative and innovative objects using reusable and recyclable materials like newspapers, shoe boxes, bangles, ice cream sticks and much more. From these items, they created an amazing array leaving everyone impressed. The values like preservation, recycling, conservation, etc were imbibed in the hearts and minds of the young ones. The students even presented a jingle using 2- 3 manageable props. Many prestigious schools participated in this mega event. The host school was also a part of the competition. The sensitivity with which each of the characters was portrayed was indeed commendable. All entries were very meticulously recorded in the form of videos and dissected based on the theme and were then handed over to the judges for selection of the overall winner. The presentations were adjudged by Ms. Neha Gulati an educationist. The judge opined that the standard of the competition was so good that it was difficult to choose the winners. The entries were adjudicated based on Creativity, Expression, Confidence and overall presentation. The event, *Eco-nnovation*, provided a platform for students from different schools to showcase their talent. Each team portrayed a unique combination of relevance, humour, confidence and social message.

An inter-school treasure hunt was organized for the students on 29th July 2022. It was a time-bound activity and the team that gathered all the clues and reached the treasure key first was declared the winner. It has been a fun way to explore different topics and apply problem-solving skills. It also provided an opportunity for children to apply high-order thinking skills to solve the clues and progress. Applying mathematics to the real world also helps children establish a context to what they have learned and how it can be useful. There were four clues and every clue lead to the next step. But before this, a small test was held to select the 4 teams who will hunt for the treasure.

The test was for about 15 minutes for the students of classes IX and X. After the results were declared, the selected four teams and other participants were taken to the next venue for the final round and the venue was outside the school. There was a lot of exhilaration as children ran from pillar to post to reach their next clue. Each clue was in the form of a riddle and the students thoroughly savoured decoding the hints. There was a display of tremendous teamwork and coordination among the team members. In the end, it was a treat to watch the winners find the "treasure" with huge smiles on their faces.

*Vanmitravali* was organised as an inter-school competition under Trishna. आगे वे स्वयं चलेंगे बस पीछे से उनका हौसला बढ़ाना होगा।'

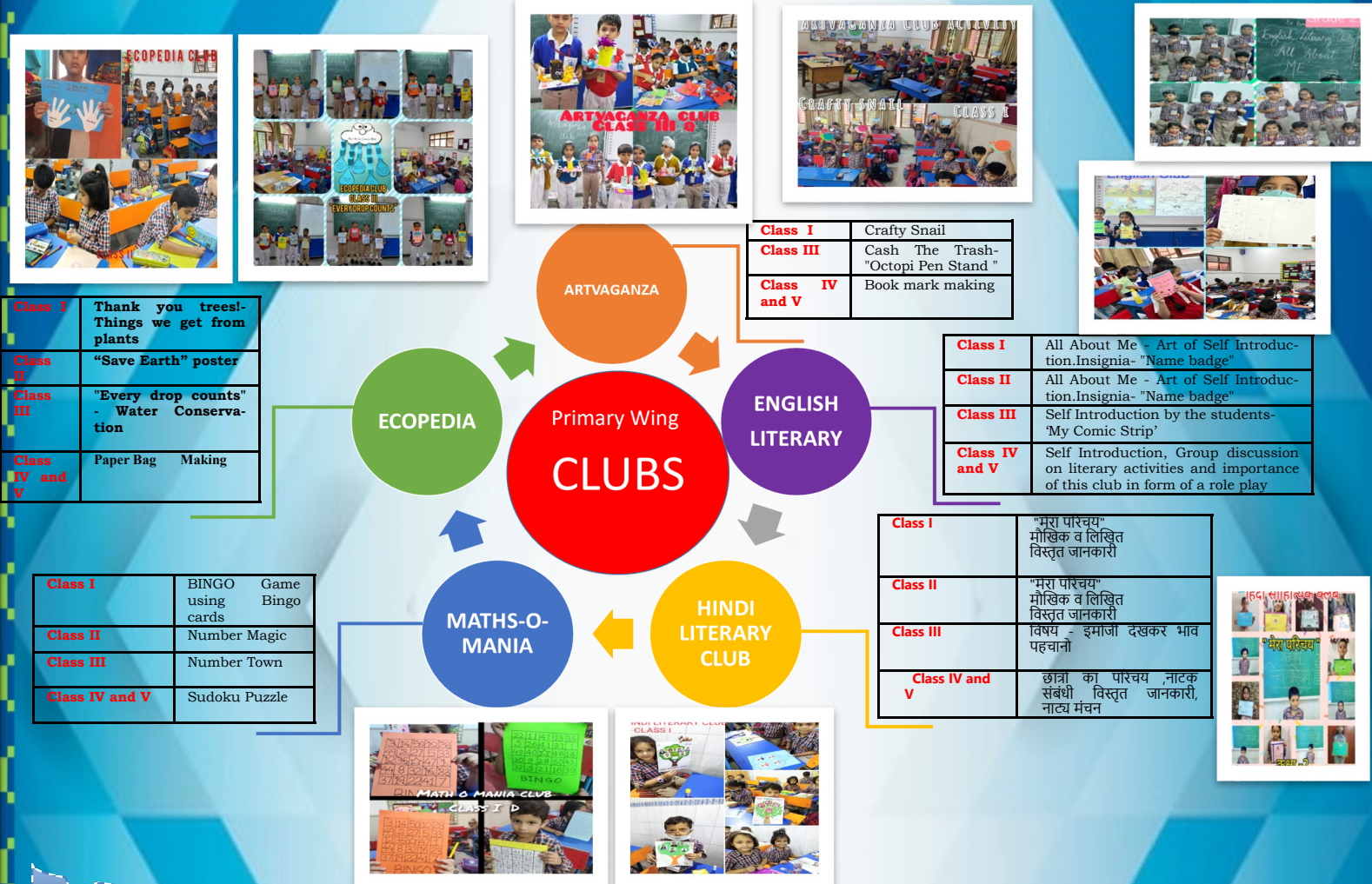

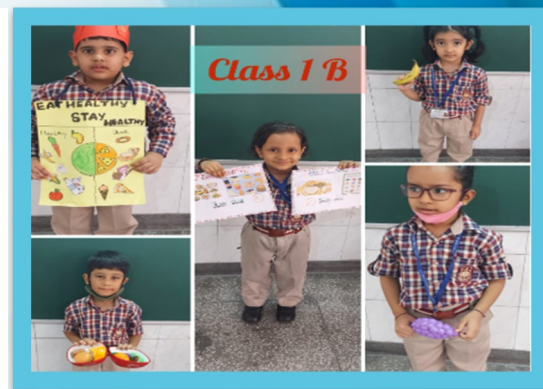
# Intra-Class Activities

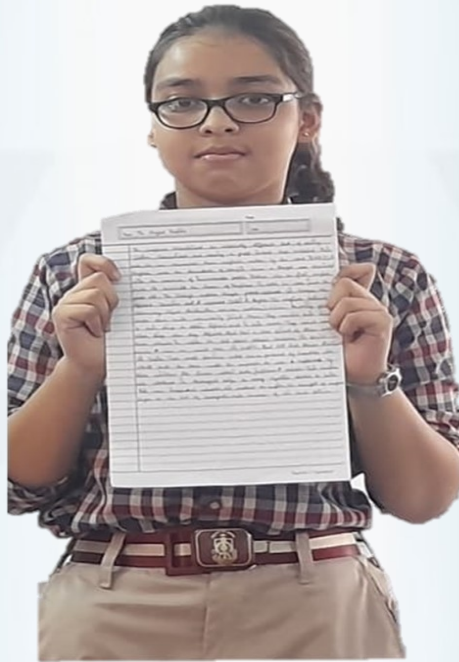
# SUBJECT ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

**"The loftier the building, the deeper must be the foundation laid."**

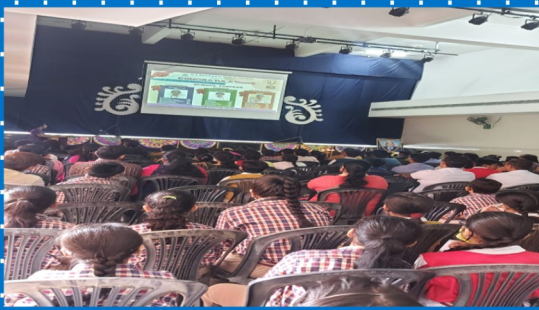
**T**he basis for a firm and strong parent teacher relationship lies in frequent and lucid communication, mutual respect and sound understanding of the what is best for a child.

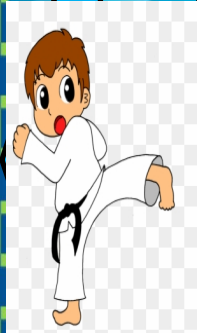

**In the Junior National Fencing Championship, June 2022 Charvi of class X won a bronze medal.**

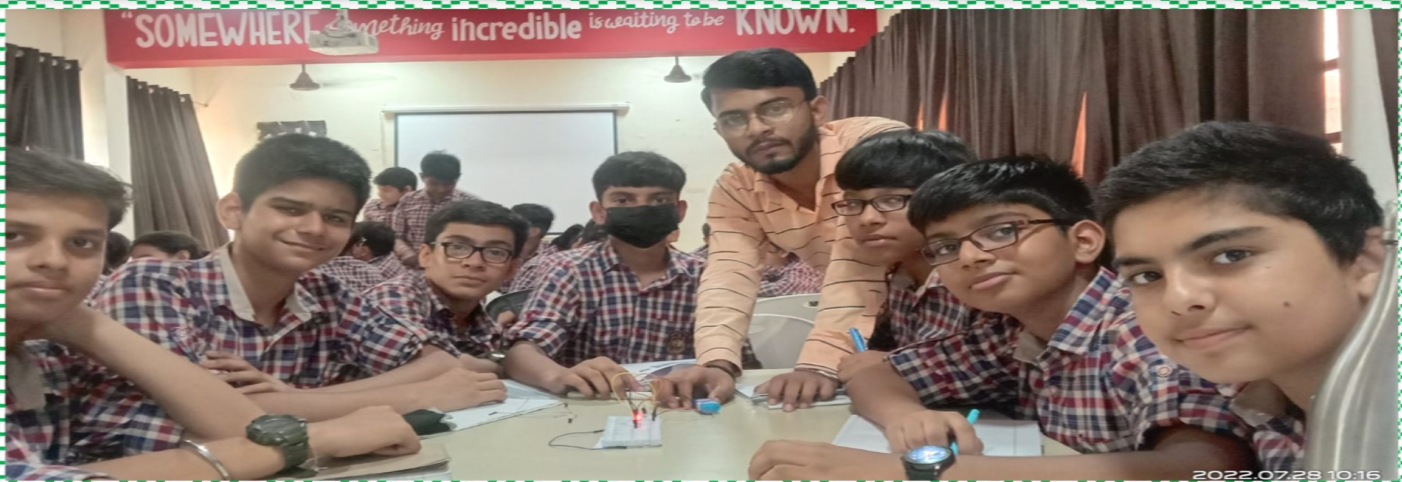


**In Fencing District Championship, July 2022 many children from our school won gold, silver and bronze medal. In this event, our school bagged two gold medals.**

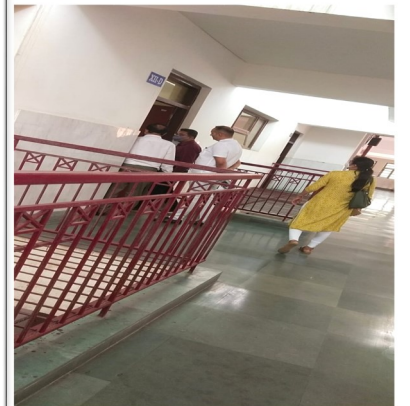

# WORKSHOP

## INCLUSION AND INCLUSIVE STRATEGIES

**T**he workshop on Inclusive Education was taken by Pre-Primary Academic Coordinator Ms Satinder Kaur for the teachers of the Junior wing and Primary wing. The workshop started with calming breathing exercises followed by tips and techniques to be implemented in classrooms for Inclusive Education. Some of the tips shared during the workshop are as follows:

- Teach Special children-various skills, to be independent, to respect others etc.
- “A to Z of Inclusion for teachers” was explained with relevant examples to educate teachers on the importance and ways of inclusion.
- Parents, teachers, peers and the community should work together for the special needs children by removing all the attitudinal and environmental barriers.
- Every child is unique and should be given unconditional acceptance without making them mascots.
- The difference between Exclusion, segregation, integration and inclusion was explained.
- A special educator and counsellor should always be involved.
- To make teaching and learning accessible to all. Teachers should use a variety of learning styles.
- Signage of Directions should be used.
- Buddy system to be followed.
- Documentation for each special needs child is essential.
- Teachers were asked to read in detail about one disability and share it with co-teachers.

In order to emphasize the need to include Special needs children in the classroom, a video was shown to the teachers. The workshop ended with important points to be implemented in classes for better and effective learning of special needs children.

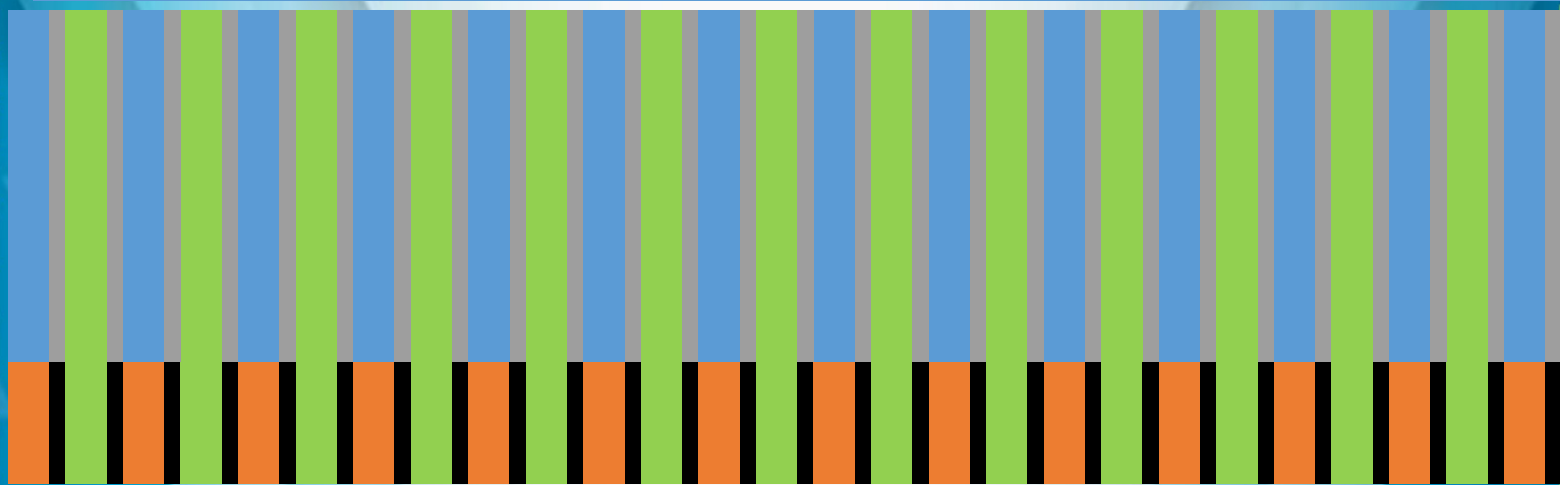
